City of Melville Tennis Strategy

At the time of last year's AGM an enormous report provided to City of Melville by Otium Consulting and recommended for adoption by the City Council had, on request of the five tennis clubs, been deferred to allow clubs to consider the recommendations. We, the clubs, were unhappy with some of the wording and recommendations in the report. Club representatives met to workshop the proposals last year, and then, along with Tennis West, met with Council Members and relevant officers and expressed their joint views. With adjustments, the Tennis Strategy was finally adopted and endorsed by the City Council on July 18th 2023.

The following is a summary of the key points of the adopted strategy:

Agreement that there is not an oversupply of tennis courts in the City. There will be no pressure for conversion of grass courts to hard surfaces, providing clubs can maintain them and remain viable.

Recognition that

- Clubs need and deserve funding to improve and or maintain infrastructure. The City expects that court maintenance and development will be funded through court hire revenue.
- Commercial coaching businesses within clubs are an integral part of teaching and developing youngsters from a very early age.
- Fencing surrounding courts is a necessary fixture for functioning and safety, and not designed to deny
 public access. But multi-use facilities are strongly encouraged.
- Uniformity of duration of lease agreements for sporting clubs should be considered. This is a work in progress as existing leases are not consistent in this regard.
- Written acknowledgement received from the City that BGPTC's lease will be extended prior to its expiry in September 2024, but the term is yet to be agreed.
- Formal six monthly meetings will be held with City officers to discuss plans, projects, funding, financial viability.

We are hopeful that on the back of the focus that the Strategy has brought to Tennis in the City of Melville we are entering a new era of positive support and collaboration between the City and its Tennis Clubs.

The most exciting challenge facing the Business portfolio presently is to upgrade the front walls of the eight squash courts in our squash centre.

The President of the Blue Gum Squash Club, whose members are the main users of the squash centre, approached us some months ago with a proposal to replace the surface of the front walls with glass. The existing plaster surface has been regularly patched over the years but is now past the stage where it can be maintained to an adequate playing standard. The adjacent photographs show what is proposed.

The tennis club, which built the squash centre back in the 1970s, leases the tennis and squash premises from the City of Melville. The squash centre is operated under a licence agreement by Mike Corren, who took over from Kane Fasolo earlier this year. Mike pays a licence fee to the tennis club, which is an important income stream for us.

An experienced, reputable contractor has been identified and has quoted on the works. Applications for grant funding have been lodged with state and federal governments and decisions are expected in the next few months. The squash club and City of Melville will also contribute to the project funding. The aim is to have the works completed before the end of this financial year.




The Group's members had another great year at BGPTC with lots of good tennis and fellowship, including post-games gatherings at Denada Café for coffee and conversations.

GENERAL NEWS

Book a Court



The Book a Court system (BAC) operates smoothly if used correctly. Most issues are the result of the actions of the last person who entered/exited the courts and can be avoided by everyone following the correct procedures:

- It is most important to ensure that the gate is ALWAYS SHUT please check it is shut before you enter your PIN and be sure to shut it again behind you as you enter and leave. This way the system will alert you if the PIN fails and will be ready and operate correctly for the next person.
- Ensure the light above the keypad flashes green after PIN entry and you hear two short beeps and the gate will allow you to enter. Your lights will not activate without correct PIN entry.
- The system will allow you access 15 minutes prior to your booking time and it is recommended that you arrive prior to your time. If the lights were already on and turn off because you have not entered your PIN on time, a cooling down period of 15-20 minutes, for synthetics only, is required before they will come on again.
- Do not hold the gate open for other users. Your considerate action may leave them playing in the dark if the above process is not followed correctly.
- Book your court at least 25 minutes prior to play to ensure that the PIN is active at the gate and be sure to book for the length of time you plan to play.
- Please use ONLY the court you have booked and finish your match on time to allow the next players to access the court without the need to wait or ask you to leave. If you wish to extend your play, simply log in and add another booking if a court is available (remembering that this will need to be done at least 25 minutes ahead to time).
- If someone is continuing to play on your court when your booking time has commenced, politely remind them that their time has finished. Playing on another court instead causes a knock-on effect and inconveniences others.
- Allow others to book the court if you are unable to play by logging in and cancelling the booking if you are unable to play.

Our courts are in high demand at times, so please cancel your booking if for some reason you are unable to play. This will allow someone else the opportunity to use it instead.
